Cataract and glaucoma surgeon



After completing my medical degree in 2006 at the University of Adelaide, I undertook internship and residency at Concord Hospital, Sydney. I was trained as an ophthalmologist at Sydney Eye Hospital. From early in my training I developed an interest in cataract surgery and glaucoma. I completed a glaucoma fellowship under the guidance of Prof Keith Martin at Addenbrooke's Hospital in Cambridge, UK. I gained valuable experience in glaucoma surgery and cataract surgery.

I am a staff specialist at Sydney Eye Hospital where I manage general eye diseases as well as being a member of the Glaucoma Unit. I find teaching and lecturing very rewarding and through Sydney University, I give lectures to medical students. At Sydney Eye Hospital I provide training to ophthalmology registrars and international fellows.

I am completing a PhD (Syd) using a new imaging technique developed in Cambridge. The aim of the research is to improve our understanding of why people develop glaucoma.
